Spotlight on Mr Barton, Deputy Headteacher

In October 2005, I started my PGCE at Hull University and was eagerly awaiting news about my first teaching placement. My first placement turned out to be at the Snaith School. Although my time at Snaith was brief, it marked my initial foray into the world of education, and I cherished every moment. So much so, that when the chance to apply for the Deputy Head post arose, I couldn't resist. Now, after a successful interview process, I find myself at the culmination of a fulfilling term.

Prior to my tenure at Snaith, I worked in two other schools. My journey began at Malet Lambert School in Hull, where I started as a Geography teacher and progressed to the role of Head of Year. In this capacity, I was responsible for leading both academic and pastoral support for a year group. After spending nine years at Malet Lambert School, I moved to Baysgarth School in North Lincolnshire. At Baysgarth, I served as an Assistant Headteacher with a focus on Attendance and Behaviour. Additionally, I played a pivotal role in the establishment of an Alternative Provision, aimed at aiding pupils who faced challenges in mainstream education.

The key element of my role lies in creating a highly effective team of teachers and support staff adept at dismantling barriers to learning. Throughout my career, I've dedicated significant time to supporting the most vulnerable pupils, acknowledging that for some, childhood is an immensely challenging experience. I count myself fortunate to be a part of a school that embraces a highly inclusive approach, with a dedicated staff that tirelessly works to support our pupils at the Snaith School.

During my leisure time, I enjoy in watching football. As a season ticket holder at Liverpool, I regularly make the journey over the Pennines on weekends. The remainder of my free time is spent with my family and two children, but I always strive to allocate at least one week a year to indulge in my favourite sporting activity—skiing in the Alps.

In life, I steadfastly believe that while qualifications are undeniably important, instilling character and resilience in pupils holds equal significance. A former colleague and friend of mine lived by the mantra that 'qualifications will get you an interview, but qualities will get you the job.' Conversations with industry recruiters affirm the truth of this statement, where experience often eclipses qualifications as individuals progress in their careers.

Revision menu

It's been a busy time for our Year 11 pupils preparing for their mock exams in December. Preparations began early in September with the launch of a new form time revision programme. Two mornings a week during tutor time, Year 11s were introduced to a revision technique and in the following session, given time to practice it. Pupils then had a revision day in November, taking part in a carousel of revision techniques in core and option subjects. A session was also delivered to all pupils by our brilliant Mind practitioner, Sally, who gave pupils some practical advice on coping with exam anxiety.

In the two weeks leading up to the mock exams, pupils were given a revision menu offering a range of revision resources, masterclasses, lunch-time drop-in sessions, after school revision and even Saturday morning revision. It was great to see the high turnout for many of the sessions and the positive feedback from pupils who felt more confident about how to revise. The 5 O'clock Club after school was a particular hit and will be revived in the new year. A huge thank you to all staff for the resources and time put into preparing Year 11 and an even bigger well done to the positive attitude and hard work demonstrated by Year 11 pupils.




Movember – staff fundraising

Careers Update and College Fair

Things have been busy at Snaith since we returned from October half term. The college application process has now been launched to year 11 and applications should be finalised before Christmas with time being made available during registration and APEX sessions along with dedicated careers lead sessions as part of our year 11 revision day. To assist with their decisions, the careers team are meeting one to one with each year 11 pupil during the school day over this half term to provide information, guidance and support. The college interview process starts just after Christmas.

We have welcomed a host of post 16 provisions into school to present assemblies, and the careers team have supported our pupils and parents with various events including tailored sessions on year 11 revision day, year 6 open evening, year 7 and 8 settling in evening, year 9 Options Evening, College Information Evening and year 10 GCSE preparation evening.

We are almost ready to launch Compass Plus, a careers platform used across East Yorkshire which supports, evidences and reviews careers provision in schools. In addition, various careers based tasks have been worked on during registration periods including raising awareness of careers typical to subject areas, Career of the Week, and most recently Green Careers Week.

We will soon be launching Work Experience to support our pupils in finding a work experience placement.

It was lovely to welcome back two former pupils, Harry and Henry, to The Snaith School, from Hill House Sixth Form. We also welcomed York College, New College, Selby College, Askam Bryan, John Leggott and South Hunsley Sixth form to our college Fair.





Remembrance Event

Our remembrance event was truly a special occasion and certainly a proud Headteacher moment. Pupils listened in silence to our quest of honour and veteran Mikey Wallis who talked about his service in the armed forces and the effect that his tours of duty had on him, his family and the comrades that he had lost. Student Voice Year 7

We are proud of how our Year 7 pupils have settled into the life here at the Snaith School. They have now completed their first full term taking advantage of all that we have to offer. We understand here at the Snaith School how daunting transition from a Primary School to a Secondary School can be for children, and also their parents. Here at Snaith, we endeavour to make this transition as seamless as possible providing all the support both parents and pupils require to help them through this important period in their lives.



Earlier this term we completed some surveys with our Year 7 pupils. We complete student voice survey regularly throughout the year as they are an important mechanism for how we can improve the school for our pupils and to gain their views and opinions on school life. The results from the surveys were very positive and confirmed to us that our Year 7 pupils have settled in very well indeed.

Odd Socks Day is designed to be fun! It's an opportunity to encourage people to express themselves and celebrate their individuality and what makes us all unique!


