It is a pleasure and a privilege to be the Headteacher of this wonderful school. I am sure you will enjoy reading our newsletter!



# Year 7 and Year 8 Settling in Evening



Thank you to all the parents and carers that attended the evening. This was an opportunity to have a face-to-face meeting with your child's form tutor and other key staff such as the SENCO – Mrs Walker and your child's year leader, either Mrs Cooper for year 7 or Mrs Anderson for year 8.

Parent/carer attendance at the event was high. We asked for feedback from you about our school and the feedback we received was fantastic.

Over 98% of parents and carers said that they would recommend our school. We are very proud of this!!

We have had a fantastic half term in the PE department. In the short space of 8 weeks, we have already achieved so much. We have held several Primary School events linked with the School Sport Co-ordinator and our feeder schools: this has included Primary Table Tennis. Well done to Snaith Primary who not only won the local partnership competition, but then went onto to win the East Riding overall winners. They now progress to the next round in Hull. We also held both the girls' and boys' Years 5 and 6 Primary football competitions. A massive well done to Snaith and Rawcliffe boys, and the girls from Pollington, who have all progressed to the next round. Over 130 pupils took part in the Cross-Country Primary School race. Top 3 places and winning teams from each category are through to the next round which takes places on 22nd Oct at Cottingham High school. Good luck to all involved.

This half term we ran 8 extra-curricular clubs a week and averaged approximately **250-300 pupils in attendance**. We hope the positive numbers continue after half-term.

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We have played several netball fixtures against local Schools. The Year 7/8/9/10 boys' football teams have played 4 fixtures in the East Riding league or cup and the Year 10 boys qualified to the next round of the National Cup. We held our own annual crosscountry races with the top 8 runners going on to represent our school in the East Riding Championships. We had several top 10 winners in their individual races.









# Extra-Curricular Opportunities


As always, we have large number of pupils completing their Bronze award for Duke of Edinburgh.

This year, Year 7 and Year 9 pupils took part in the 'Restart a Heart' event, in conjunction with Yorkshire Ambulance Service. We worked hard to become #CPRConfident, learning that chances of survival drop 10% a minute if CPR is not started as soon as someone has had a cardiac arrest.

Our amazing volunteers from the ambulance service guided us through the skills needed to save a life and our pupils did us so proud: listening well, getting stuck in with the demonstrations and asking very thoughtful questions. Louise, the First Responder in attendance, said that in four years of taking part in Restart A Heart Day, our Snaith pupils were "the best she had ever seen!"










# World Mental Health Day 2024

### **Attendance Counts**

Being around teachers and friends in a school environment is the best way for students to learn and reach their potential. Time in school also keeps children safe and provides access to extra-curricular opportunities and pastoral care.



Being in school every day that it is open, is important to your child's achievement, wellbeing, and their wider development. Evidence shows that the students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE and A Level results. Generally the higher the percentage of lessons missed across the key stage at KS2 and KS4, the lower the level of attainment at the end of the key stage.

If your child's attendance level is falling, then we will contact you to explore the reasons and discuss what help can be put in place to help them overcome the barriers they are facing.

If your child is struggling to attend school, you can expect us to meet with you and your child. The school want to understand the reasons for their absence and what we can do to support you or your child and what we can do to overcome the barriers to attendance they are experiencing.
