This is a fantastic achievement and reflects the strength of our community and the sense of belonging our pupils feel—it truly shows that our school is a family.

Looking ahead, we are ambitious to achieve even more this year. We take pride in our strong academic reputation, our traditional values, and our excellent pastoral care.
