Pupils in Year 11 have worked extremely hard this term preparing for their GCSE examinations. Our "Steps to Success" evening was well attended and the feedback from year 11 parents and carers was extremely positive. We offer a wide-ranging revision menu which includes drop-in sessions during lunchtime, intervention sessions after school and on a weekend, online resources, and our five o'clock club. In addition, we have launched Tassomai, an online revision programme for English, Maths and Science, and our mentoring programme. Feedback from pupils and parents has been extremely positive to our vast range of things on offer to pupils. We are extremely proud of how pupils have engaged with the support available to them and how maturely they have approached their mock exams. We do realise it is sometimes difficult for pupils to attend due to the distance that they have to travel home. Please do get in touch if your child is unable to attend due to transport issues and we will be happy to help wherever we can.

I have continued to hold pupil voice meetings throughout the term; these are always a highlight of my week. I look forward to meeting pupils and listening to their views which are insightful, mature, and honest. We are working on some of the changes that pupils have suggested, such as more benches outside to sit on and socialise with their friends at break and lunchtime.




National Citizen Service (NCS)




Curriculum - Jekyll and Hyde at York Grand Opera House

Curriculum - WeCompose at The Junction

On 24 January pupils attended an Introductory Concert at Junction, Goole where they listened to the Ligeti String Quartet perform a wide selection of pieces including ones by Franz Schubert, Dmitry Shostakovich and more modern composers such as Anna Meredith. They had a chance to talk to the members of the quartet after the concert and they asked lots of good questions such as what inspired them to decide to be a professional musician.

All the pupils will be writing a composition for the Ligeti Quartet which will be performed in a Culmination Concert in June, and we also had a professional composer, Ellen Sargent, visit the school to work with the pupils on their compositions. Ellen's first visit was on 9th February, she showed our pupils an example of her own composition work as well as listening to the pupils' ideas so far. She will be making 2 more visits in March and April which our pupils are very much looking forward to!

Celebrations – Rewards and Certificates

Each week our pupils collect reward stamps in their planners to reward them for demonstrating their ability to be Ready, Respectful and Safe. Stamps are awarded both inside and outside of the classroom. We collate these stamps weekly during Form Time. The more stamps a pupil receives the higher the level of certificate they receive.


As a school, we are incredibly proud of how hard our students work on a daily basis and how well our students conduct themselves when on our school site or taking part in off-sites visits. This is evidenced in the number of pupils who have received certificates this year.

To date the following numbers of pupils have received each level of certificate:

Bronze – 738
Silver – 676
Gold – 404
Platinum - 181
Diamond – 4

There are 14 weeks remaining at school this academic year giving pupils plenty of time to gain the highest tier of certificates.

Year 10 Prefect Launch

The opportunity to become a Prefect was launched to current Year 10s in February and the uptake has been brilliant. The amount of volunteers we have had for after school events before the launch took place has been fantastic. Pupils are keen to help and the feedback from staff present at the events has been really positive. The pupils are polite, hard working and are great ambassadors for the school.

It is lovely to see so many applications from pupils. The deadline for applications is the 22nd March. We cannot wait to read them.



Votes for Schools

Next term we will be launching a new Form Time activity to all pupils in Years 7 to 10. We will be utilising resources from an organisation called Votes for Schools. Votes for Schools aims to get 100,000 young people voting on topical issues facing society today. During Form Time, pupils will be presented with a topical question.

The Form Tutor will then show a presentation provided by Votes for Schools. At the end of the presentation, the pupils will then vote with either a Yes or No answer to the question provided. We are aiming for this to help ensure that our pupils are well informed about topical issues, learn important skills about debating and develop improved levels of tolerance when considering other people's opinions.

Voting is completed by a show of hands. The Form Tutor simply records the number of Yes and No votes onto the Votes for Schools voting page. The individual names of the voters are not recorded. The topics align to the National Guidance on Personal and Social Education which we teach through our APEX curriculum.

These are some examples of the questions asked so far this year:

- · Is AI-generated content too believable?
- · Should the gender of your role models matter?
- · Will you be the first smoke-free generation?
- · Are adults equipped to teach you about the online world?

Each week the school receives a graph showing how we voted as a school compared to how the rest of the region and the country voted. We will then share the results weekly on our social media platforms and with our pupils during Form Time.



Pupil Voice

During this term we have asked our pupils for feedback on unstructured time during breaks and lunchtimes. Some of the suggestions our pupils have put forward are:

- A sheltered/covered area outside to provide protection from the elements.
- An increased number of clubs to attend during lunchtime.
- Quiet study spaces for Y10/Y11 pupils to use during lunchtime.
- The provision of snack bar to reduce queuing times in the Dining Hall.
- Introduction of a Breakfast Club.

We are very impressed with the number of sensible suggestions put forward. The school is now considering these suggestions and will report back to both parents and pupils next term with regards to any potential improvements/developments to any of the suggestions put forward.

Another great half term in the PE Department; it is difficult knowing where to start! Since Christmas, we have held numerous Primary School sporting events for our feeder schools. We have held the Y3/4 and Y5/6 indoor athletics event, with the amazing help from some of our sport leaders. We have also run the Y3/4 dodgeball tournament, which, like the indoor athletics, proved to be a major success.

Netball - Our girls (all year groups) have been very fortunate to play numerous netball fixtures against local schools, including the Y10 end of season competition. This has had a positive impact on netball club attendance, with Mrs Farmer reaching an all-time high with the number of attendees.

During this very busy period, we have managed to squeeze in a 2-day bake sale. Raising nearly £500 for the netball and football tours to Barcelona and Lisbon in May.









Cricket - The school accessed some funding from the Yorkshire Cricket Board, who supplied a weekly coach into School to teach our girls some cricket skills. Mrs Willden also arranged for this opportunity to extend to a number of primary school girls as an after-school club. Continuing with the success of cricket, more recently, Mr Wilson and Mr Collins have established cricket clubs after school to offer both boys and girls a further opportunity to access the sport, in preparation for the summer fixtures, and the approaching indoor cricket regional finals day.

Cross Country - Several of our pupils represented the school in the Humberside cross country championships and did exceptionally well.







Football – More success has come in football: Our Y7/9 boys have reached the final of the East Riding plate; the Y8 boys are set to play their semi-final match before Easter; and equally as impressive, the Y10s are set to represent the school in their semifinal match in the East Riding cup. Good Luck to all the boys involved in these matches. The girls have also had success in the Leeds United go-ahead tournament, earlier on in the year. Monday night Y8/9 football club continues to run and grow with numbers, as does Mr Appleyard's Tuesday night Y7 training.

Table Tennis - Further success has been seen in table tennis, where two of our Y8 boys represented the school in the regional finals, both finishing within the top 4 places.

The spring term saw us launch this year's work experience programme with the introduction of the new work experience app. The ConnectEd App provides pupils with pre-placement resources, skills builders and resources that help each pupil prepare and manage their own work placements.

174 pupils in year 10 will take part in work experience for two weeks between the 1st-12th July 2024. This programme offers firsthand experience of the workplace giving pupils the chance to explore careers, opportunities and employer networks.

Attendance Counts

Being around teachers and friends in a school environment is the best way for students to learn and reach their potential. Time in school also keeps children safe and provides access to extra-curricular opportunities and pastoral care.

Being in school every day that it is open, is important to your child's achievement, wellbeing, and their wider development. Evidence shows that the students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE and A Level results. Generally, the higher the percentage of lessons missed across the key stage at KS2 and KS4, the lower the level of attainment at the end of the key stage.

If your child's attendance level is falling, then we will contact you to explore the reasons and discuss what help can be put in place to help them overcome the barriers they are facing.

If your child is struggling to attend school, you can expect us to meet with you and your child. The school want to understand the reasons for their absence and what we can do to support you or your child and what we can do to overcome the barriers to attendance they are experiencing.
