

As pupils have now returned to school from the summer break, I wanted to remind you about the online revision platform and app called Tassomai, which all pupils in Y10 and Y11 have access to. This is a fantastic resource to help with revision for English, Maths, Science and Modern Foreign Languages. Tassomai aims to helps pupils develop subject knowledge and focuses upon retrieval practice.

Tassomai is part of pupils' weekly homework. We will have a workshop on Tassomai for Y10 parents/carers as part of our 'Welcome to GCSE' evening on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2025 where there will be an opportunity for you to see how it works and ask any questions.

You will shortly receive another request from <u>Wonde</u> to connect with Tassomai. If you accept this request, you are giving Tassomai permission to access your email address. In doing so, you will receive a weekly progress report each Monday morning. Please see the example on the left.

Each week, you will receive an email that gives you access to your own personalised parent dashboard, where you can monitor your child's usage and activity on Tassomai. You can also see their recommended resources and their "Trees". The Tree is a visual depiction of your child's usage. The leaves indicate a particular topic, the size of the leaf indicates how much time your child has spent on that topic. The colour of the leaf indicates how much they have understood. A green leaf therefore indicates secure knowledge, whilst an amber or red leaf illustrates an area of focus for your child.

Pupils will be set a specific target to reach each week by each subject – this will form part of their homework (e.g. in Science, pupils must complete 100% of their weekly goal **or** spend 30 minutes on science quizzes, whichever is first).

We hope that you sign up to receive the progress reports, please talk to your child about the Tassomai app and ask them to show you how it works. Pupil feedback from other year groups has been overwhelmingly positive.
