I am delighted to inform you that 95% of parents and carers have expressed that they would recommend our school to others. We are expecting a large cohort in September!

One of our proudest achievements this term has been the improvement in school attendance, which currently stands at 94.1%. This places us in the top 25% of schools nationally. While this is an excellent result, we remain committed to further improving attendance, and with your ongoing support, we are confident we will continue to see progress.





GCSE Science Live!



Attendance Counts

We would like to thank parents and carers for working in partnership with us to achieving school attendance. Our current school attendance is 94.1%, that is almost 2% above the national average, We are very proud of how our pupils want to be in school every day.



Being around teachers and friends in a school environment is the best way for pupils to learn and reach their potential. Time in school also keeps children safe and provides access to extracurricular opportunities and pastoral care.

Being in school every day that it is open is important to your child's achievement, wellbeing, and their wider development. Evidence shows that the pupils with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE results. Generally, the higher the percentage of lessons missed across the key stage at KS2 and KS4, the lower the level of attainment at the end of the key stage.

If your child's attendance level is falling, then we will contact you to explore the reasons and discuss what assistance can be put in place to help them overcome the barriers they are facing.

If your child is struggling to attend school, you can expect us to meet with you and your child. The school want to understand the reasons for their absence and what we can do to support you or your child.
