Year 10 Homework

Throughout Year 10, we have increased the frequency and quantity of homework being set. We have also presented pupils with a range of revision strategies during form time. This has been done with the aim of helping to embed improved study habits in preparation of next year's GCSE examinations.

We have created a homework timetable for this last half term, so that we can share with you the expectations surrounding homework from each subject. This timetable also highlights what homework should be completed over the two weeks of work experience and over the summer break, to ensure that pupils are in the best position, ready to start Year 11.

A lot of the homework set over the next few weeks is designed to help pupils prepare for their end of Year 10 assessments too.

For pupils who wish to complete their homework in school, homework club is available on Wednesday and Friday lunchtimes in the library. Pupils can also access resources such as laptops, revision guides and textbooks for support. From Wednesday 11th June, the library will also be available from 15.15 until 16.30 (Monday to Thursday) – pupils will need to sign up on the library door to attend.

Our current cohort of Year 11 pupils will have completed their final GCSE examinations in coming days. Feedback from our Year 11 pupils demonstrates the value of the homework set on Tassomai with many Year 11 pupils citing the improved preparedness for their examinations owing to the amount of time they invested in Tassomai, GCSE Pod and independent revision. We will be speaking with Year 10 pupils before they go on their work experience placements to begin the process of preparing them for their final year at The Snaith School.

Mrs Price will continue to be your child's Year Leader next year, however specific issues relating to homework should be directed to your child's subject teachers in the first instance.
