

Year 9 & Year 10 Recommended Reading

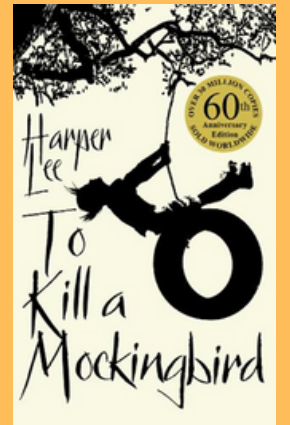


King of Nothing by Nathanael Lessore
